- 1c. minced fresh parsley
- 1 c. chopped green onions
- ½ c. shredded parmesan cheese
- 1 tsp. ground cumin
- 1 ½ tsp. salt and ¾ tsp. pepper
- ½ tsp. hot pepper sauce
- 1/8 tsp. cayenne pepper
- 3 tblsp. olive oil or veg. oil
- 2 cloves garlic minced
- 6 tblsp. Lime juice

Combine first 12 ingredients. Combine garlic and oil and heat in microwave on high 1 minute. Cool, whisk in lime juice

Pour over corn mixture and toss, cover and refrigerate until serving, about 4 hours.

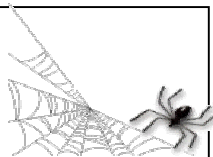
