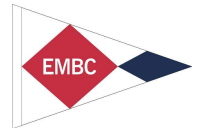

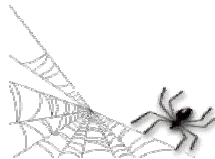

This is just a quick note of thanks to all those who voted for my chili at the EMBC Chili Fest, "thanks a lot".

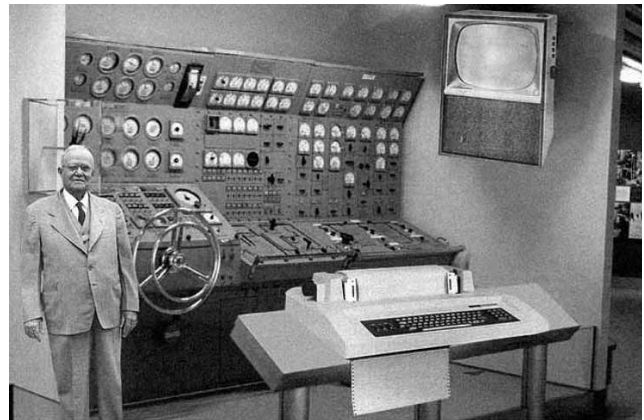
