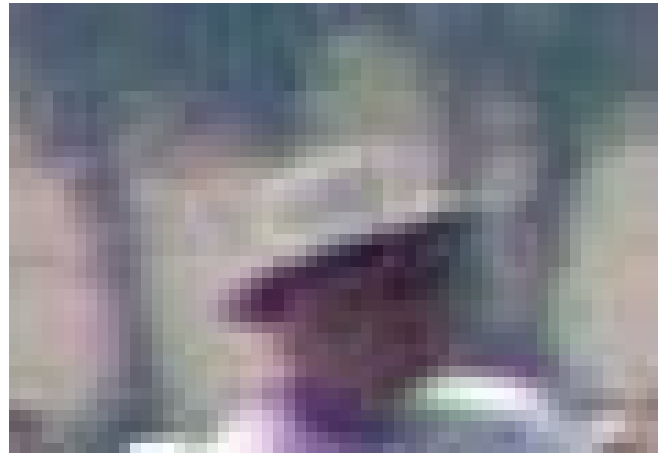

Robotic Alarm Clock Rolls Away and Hides

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. - Before you hit the snooze button a second time on this alarm clock, you'll have to hunt it down.

The shag carpet-covered robotic alarm clock on wheels, called Clocky, rolls away and hides.

The clock is the invention of Gauri Nanda, a graduate student - and occasional over sleeper - who works in the Media Lab at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

"I've been known to hit the snooze bar for a couple hours, wake up two hours later and be completely shocked," said Nanda, 25, who created Clocky for an industrial design course last year.

She made a prototype out of foam, a pair of wheels and a circuit board connected to small motors. "It is programmed to tell the motors to move randomly, to generate random speeds and directions so that the clock ends up in a new place every day," she said.

Nanda's adviser, V. Michael Bove Jr., said hundreds of people interested in buying or selling the clocks have called and e-mailed. But the gadget is not yet available for sale.

Nanda is thinking of starting her own business to manufacture and market the clock.

MIT owns the intellectual property rights to Clocky and other student inventions, but Bove said Nanda would receive a share of any revenue generated.

Nanda said she wanted Clocky to remind its owners of a troublesome pet.

"The idea really was to use technology in a more playful way," she said. "It's sort of like a hide-and-seek game."

The following is another update from Minnesota Mike Tougas. Diving and Lovin' it.

We went to Jellyfish Lake the other day to go snorkeling. It was pretty cool. You had to hike up and down a really steep hill as the islands here are very steep. There are actually something like 7 Jellyfish lakes on that one island. You can't dive it because if you go toward the bottom there is a layer of Hydrogen Sulfide and it will severely burn your skin. The shark diving is awesome however. I've probably swam with at least 100 sharks so far. I'm still waiting to swim with Hammerheads, Manta Rays and Whale Sharks. Hopefully soon. So far things have been a little slow as we have been doing maintenance since I got here. I finally have a trip going out this Saturday for 10 days. I will finally get a chance to see how the trip operates and where to go. The currents here are so strong sometimes that you need to hold onto your mask and regulator or it will get swept right off. We hook ourselves to the reef with hooks to be able to stay in one place and watch the sharks and fish. There must be millions of fish on every dive. Sea turtles, Barracudas, Clownfish etc. Anyway, I guess the boat has a cell phone for people to get a hold of us. I will get the number soon. Most everyone here has a cell phone. I was a little surprised by that. We also have a water ban going on now as there is a shortage. They don't make water, they wait for it to rain and they collect it in a damn. The people here are rather intelligent and fairly well educated. Most people are from the Philippines. The other day I went out on a day boat and we had people from Japan, Israel, Switzerland, Philippines, Spain, Italy and the U.S. all on one boat. It's great to meet all these people. I have also been invited to stay with some people from the Philippines who are rather wealthy whenever I get the chance to go there. I'm working with people from all over and they like to do the same thing. Bounce around from one place to the next. I might be sharing an apartment with a fellow videographer from England. Of course I won't be there very often as I will be on the boat most of the time. Anyway, that's the scoop for now. Take care. Mike

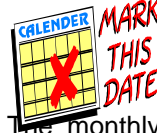

Types of Membership

1. Regular – A person (or persons) who own a boat, or a member of his/her immediate family. Can consist of 1 person or 2 people, living at the same address in which case one person must be designated the Primary Member. The other member (co-member) can be a Spouse, Significant Other, or child eighteen years of age or older. Regular members in good standing shall have all rights and privileges of the CLUB.
2. Associate – Associate membership shall be granted to persons who do not own a boat but are associated with a regular member in good standing. Associate members shall have limited privileges of the CLUB, except those of holding office, voting at meetings or of holding any right, title, or interest in the property or assets of the CLUB.
3. Life – All members in good standing with 10 years or more in the CLUB, upon reaching the age of 62, shall be eligible for a Life Membership Card. A Life Member shall have all rights as that of a regular member.

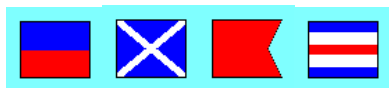
